- And I especially thank Her Excellency Ambassador Gil of Colombia, for the great cooperation over the last year.
- And particularly for your role in facilitating the
 Memorandum of Understanding between UNIDO and UNODC.

- Last year was the sixtieth anniversary of the G77, which we celebrated here at the VIC.
- It was a major milestone much has been achieved in those sixty years.
- The Group is a force for economic growth, and giving a louder voice to developing countries on the world stage.
- And this is more necessary now than ever, especially after the current decisions in the US.
- UNIDO is also a voice for your countries in the United Nations and the international community, and at conferences such as the COP.
- Your countries are most affected by climate change, and this is just one example.
- Going forward, UNIDO will continue to support you through key programmes – especially in access to energy and energy transition, digitalization, technology and knowledge transfer, fight against hunger and climate change.

- A highlight of last year was UNIDO's World Without Hunger conference.
- Our study shows and makes it clear that a world without hunger is possible, it just depends on the political will.
- It marked the start of new, intensified effort to end hunger in developing countries around the world.
- It concluded with the Addis Ababa Call to Action.
- At UNIDO we are working hard on building new partnerships.
- For example we announced a lighthouse solution for the digital and sustainable transformation of Africa's coffee value chain.
- Working with the International Coffee Organization, illycaffè, Lavazza, Google and others - private sector partnerships.
- Another example, we established a Centre of Excellence with China in Ethiopia.
- Such innovative partnerships are the way forward for all of us.

This year I plan to travel to several G77 Member
 States.

- 2024 was a very successful year for UNIDO. Our fund mobilization increased. From \$328 million in 2023, to \$664 million in 2024.
- The discussions on **UNIDO's Programme and Budgets 2026-2027** are coming up.
- I hope for your strong support during this process
- I have ambitious plans for the future to strengthen our cooperation
- TC delivery increased by 29% in 2024, and this gave us the opportunity for a much stronger cooperation, more projects, more partnerships with your countries.
- Most of our projects are in cooperation with you.
- Looking ahead, your presence and your voices at UNIDO's General Conference at the end of this year will be critical.
